Instructional Opportunities

If you're a professor moving your course online, consider partnering with Clemson Libraries:

- Add a librarian to your Canvas courses using the "Librarian" role. An "Ask the Librarian" discussion board is monitored by the librarian and allows students to ask research questions and see responses given to their classmates.
- [Ask a librarian to teach](#) a research skills workshop through Zoom.
- We can provide online training sessions and expert help for using [Adobe software](#) to create graphics, videos, or podcasts.
- Assign your students to watch a film available through one of our streaming services such as [Kanopy](#) or [Films on Demand](#). You can even check out [TigerFlix](#) provided by student government.
- Increase your students' research skills by assigning [Clemson Libraries tutorials](#), a [Plagiarism Course](#), or a course on [Conducting a Literature Review](#).
- Add a library assignment to explore particular [databases](#) or review literature on a topic.
- Contact your [Subject Librarian](#) to talk about the options!
